## EU DEBATE ABOUT UNEMPLOYMENT

### Italian Students:

“Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen, we are here today to solve the serious problem of youth unemployment in European countries. Is it possible that our young people are no longer forced to seek work abroad and new jobs are created in their own countries?”

The sectors that are most in crisis In Italy, the country that we represent, where our young people cannot find work , are mainly the primary sector and the secondary sector and we can distinguish two types of unemployment that can be defined as the involuntary unemployment and involuntary unemployment.

Our agriculture is in crisis because our fields are abandoned because of competition coming from foreign markets and because of an europeanpolicy which favors imports and the sale of foreign products that are lowering the price of internal products.

So farmers, spending more than they earn, abandon the activity and they don't hire more workers.

Besides a lot of young people don't want to work in the agricultural fields even when they have the possibility to do

that. They aspire to be taken in the most prestigious places of work and they refuse to work in the agricultural fields considering it as a humble work, poorly paid and which does not offer prospects for the future.

Instead the lack of jobs in the secondary sector is closely related to the crisis of Italian industries. The high tax and the inability to pay taxes induces entrepreneurs to close their factories or to hire irregular workers which discourages young people from working in enterprises.

Therefore do we want, that our young people continue to flee the country or that they continue to look at the future with confidence?

We want, however, that our young people continue to dream and realize their dreams, feeling realized in the professional world.

So we European states we all, we have to strive together to create new jobs at home. To create new jobs in the primary sector we must raise its autonomy through the following concrete actions:

We must:

- acquire derelict lands
- plunder them
- sell them to 1 euro with the obligation to cultivate them
- provide a subsidy to encourage the first start of this activity
- and ask for a share in the the extent of 15%
- choose a form of profit investment that allows us to make it grow.

In this way, each State would be able to relaunch primary business activities while at the same time gathering new

capital to invest in creating new jobs in the most modern start-up sectors where young people can spend their skills without the need leave their countries of origin.
