Okupacija Jugoslavije travanj 1941.

- 25.3.1941. Yugoslavia joined Tripartite pact
- April war– Hitler and allies attacked Yugoslavia
- 17.4. capitulation of Yugoslavia
- king Petar II Karađorđević and government run from country
- territory of Croatia and Bosnia and Herzegovina- Independent State of Croatia (NDH)
- Chetniks – Serbia, Montenegro, BiH, Slovenia

- Sisak squad
 - forest Brezovica near Sisak
 - **Vlado Janić Capo**

- 79 fighters (38 survivors)
 - all Croatians, except one Serbian lady



Growing of partisan movement

- successes- Dalmatia, Gorski Kotar, Lika, Kordun, Banija
- Croatia and Serbian population
- 500 000 Croatian citizens were participating
- fights against ustaše, chetniks, nazis, fascist

- Top of Yugoslavian command promised establishing of Croatian state after the war


GRADJANSTVU SPLITA!




Partisan organisations

- Internationally recognized borders
- Axis borders in occupied Yugoslavia

- The Republic of Užice in 1941
- The Republic of Bihać in 1942

Leader **Draža Mihajlović**

- leader of Serbian army
- help from london, but he was on nazi side
- he wanted Big Serbia

Pop Momčilo Đujić, Bosna

- crimes against Croats and muslims
(Fojnica, zaleđe Dalmacije...)
- Ivana Gorana Kovačića (opet) – killed by chetniks



- Chetniks wanted Kingdom of Yugoslavia
- 1943. → Tito discovered that they are on nazi`s side
- collaboration with ustaše
- they supported NDH!
